- All guests staying in the Main Inn enjoy a continental breakfast each morning. Continental breakfast is served from 8:00 - 10:00am and includes: coffee, assortment of teas, juice, apples and oranges, choice of cereals, English muffins and toast.

- A service charge of 6% per day and 9% (or current rate) Vermont State rooms tax are applicable to all rates. The service charge is shared by employees who provided services to you during your stay. Dining gratuities are not included.
- Guests are not allowed to smoke in their quest rooms and common areas. A \$200 cleaning fee will be charged for those who do not abide by this policy.
- Daily housekeeping services provided for all accommodations.
- Complimentary use of canoes, kayaks and bicycles are available.
- One dog under 50 lbs is permitted per room (excluding the Governor Aiken Room, Gazebo Room, and Lakeview cottage) or Lakefront cottage subject to approval when booking reservation. A \$30.00++ per night service fee applies.



In 2003, Shawn Dutil caught a 35 lb, 3.2 oz trout from Lake Willoughby (the Vermont State record). It is no wonder that the area is a mecca for fishing year-round! The pristine waters of Lake Willoughby (up to 300' deep in spots) and the many area streams and ponds are home to many species. Expect to net large trout, salmon, muskelllunge and more! Innsider's Tip: The Willoughby River is also a "hot spot" for fly-fishing trout. The Barton and Black Rivers are good spots as well and the Clyde River which has an outstanding run of landlocked Atlantic salmon.

With 37,575 acres of public lakes and ponds, 3,840 miles of rivers and streams and 50 public boat launches, the area is renowned for flat and high water paddling. 

DISCOVER WORLD CLASS ICE CLIMBING

According to John Kascenska of Kingdom Adventures Mountain Guides in East Burke, the Northeast Kingdom and White Mountains host some of the best ice climbing available.

"Lake Willoughby is considered one of the premiere ice climbing locations in the entire country," he said. "We are lucky. We have a beautiful resource here in all seasons – great rock climbing, wonderful ice climbing, downhill skiing, back country skiing, mountain biking."

Until a couple years ago, you could find Kascenska on the campus of Lyndon State College looking every bit an academic dean and professor. But now he's retired from academia and you may need to look higher to find him – specifically, to the top of the nearest cliff.

"I have a great interest in mountaineering and going into high places," he said. Climbing continues on 40

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History of the Willough Vale Inn & Cottages



Willoughby Lake has inspired many people to poetic expression, including Robert Frost.

In 1909 before Frost had attained fame and fortune, he and his family camped in tents on the George Conley farm. A Doctor Wells owned the farm, which later became the WilloughVale Inn. The Conleys ran the farm for Dr. Wells.

Frost hoped to avoid hay fever from ragweed by spending the summer outdoors in northern Vermont. He had also heard that the Willoughby Lake region was a wonderful place for botanists, though he later gave up his botany expeditions because the summer pollen brought on his problem.

Frost's four children made friends with other children at the lake. One vacationer at the Myers homestead (Willoughby Farm) remembers that she and her sister played with daughter Lesley who was ten years old and son Carol who was seven.

Frost would go to the Conley farmhouse for milk and eggs. Conley was road foreman then, and some of the workmen boarded at the farm. Mrs. Conley was a hard-working person. Frost apologized for taking her time, but she told him it was good to "rest a mite." The woman in his poem "A Servant to Servants," published in North of Boston in 1914 was, he said, a composite of three women; Mrs. Conley was one of them.

How did Willoughby Lake get its name?

One story is that two brothers named Willoughby, early settlers of Westmore, gave the lake their name. But there is no one by that name listed among the settlers in the town records. Neither does the name Willoughby appear in the list of Westmore proprietors in Abby Maria Hemenway's 1877 Gazetteer. However, it must be remembered that the settlers temporarily abandoned Westmore about the time the 1812 war broke out, so there were a few years when no town records were kept.

Another story is that many years ago a man named Willoughby was crossing the ice with a horse-drawn sled. When the horses broke through, Willoughby and his driver were drowned, and the lake was called Willoughby in his memory.
